- 1> Knight Rider - David Hasselhoff played the part of Michael Knight, a crime fighter with a high-tech car.
- 2> The A-Team - A feature film based on the series was released by 20th Century Fox in June of 2010.
- 3> 1989 - Titled 'Simpsons Roasting on an Open Fire', the first episode aired on December 17th of 1989. It had 26.7 million viewers.
- 4> Lucky - During the series, ALF often tries to catch Lucky with the intention of making the cat a meal.
- 5> Laverne and Shirley - Laverne and Shirley were originally introduced on Happy Days as friends of Fonzie.
- 6> Family Ties - Fox received the role of Alex P. Keaton after Matthew Broderick turned it down.
- 7> Phylicia Rashad - The Crosby Show aired for eight seasons from September 20, 1984 until April 30, 1992.
- 8> Ferrari 308 GTS - Magnum, P.I. was one of the highest-rated TV shows on U.S. television during the eighties.
- 9> Kirk Cameron - All four stars of the Golden Girls received an Emmy Award for their roles in the series.
- 10> Winnie - During its five-year run, the Wonder Years won 22 awards and was nominated for 54 more.
- 11> Their dog - Robert Wagner and Stefanie Powers played the roles of the wealthy couple Jonathan and Jennifer Hart.
- 12> Opening Night at the Boar's Nest - The Dukes of Hazzard TV series was inspired by the 1975 film Moonrunners.
- 13> The Hogan Family - Valerie Harper and Jason Bateman played the roles of Valerie and David Hogan.
- 14> Sorry, we're closed - The theme song for the show was 'Where Everybody Knows Your Name'.
- 15> Star Trek - The Next Generation - Airing for seven seasons at 178 episodes, Star Trek - The Next Generation ran longer than any other Star Trek series.
