- 1> 1800 The Geographic South Pole is the site of Amundsen-Scott South Pole Station.

- 4> Emperor The Emperor Penguin treks up to 75 miles over the ice to breeding colonies, which may include thousands of individuals.
- 5> Fram Fram is preserved at the Fram Museum in Oslo, Norway.
- 6> 1950s It was not until 1956 that humans again set foot at the South Pole, when a party led by Admiral George J. Dufek of the US Navy landed there.
- 7> 90 Percent If all of this ice were melted, sea levels would rise about 200 feet.
- 8> Norway The territory comprises one-sixth of the total area of Antarctica and lies between the British Antarctic Territory to the west and the Australian Antarctic Territory to the east.
- 9> Vinson Massif The highest point of Vinson Massif is Mount Vinson at 16,050 feet. 10> McMurdo Station McMurdo Station is a U.S. Antarctic research center located on the southern tip of Ross Island, which is in the New Zealand-claimed Ross Dependency on the shore of McMurdo Sound.
