4> Forgery - Francis died at the age of 59 of Typhoid fever.

5> Dame Enid Lyons - Lyons was made a Dame of the Order of Australia on Australia Day in 1980. A year before she died.

6> South Australia - Kangaroo Island's closest point to the mainland is eight miles off Cape Jervis.

7> Captain James Cook - Together with two neighbouring islands, Norfolk Island forms one of Australia's external territories.

8> Isaac Nichols - Nichols was transported to Australia for seven years in 1790 for theft.

9> Cape Byron - Cape Byron houses one of the last 19th-century Victorian era lighthouses.

10>1956 - The first transmission was introduced by Bruce Gyngell with the words 'Good evening, and welcome to television'.

11> The Spirit of Progress - In April 1962, the Spirit of Progress began going to Sydney.

12> 1868 - The apple has a light green skin and a crisp, juicy flesh.

13> Major George Johnston - 26 January 1808 - 1 January 1810.

14> Mersey River - Devonport is the major regional centre of the northwestern part of Tasmania.
