5> Ham - Artsoppa is a pea or split pea soup.

6> Rum - Often garnished with a pineapple wedge and maraschino cherry.

7> Fruit Bread - Stollen is usually made with chopped candied fruit, nuts and spices.

8> South Africa - The meat used for the dish is most often beef or lamb.

9> Cabbage - A slaw variant is broccoli slaw, which uses shredded broccoli instead of cabbage.

10> Oysters - The earliest known reference to carpetbag steak is in an 1891 US newspaper.

11> Onion - An adjective, lyonnaise means 'cooked with onions'.

12> Carrots - The term can also describe a dish that has carrots as an ingredient.

13> Avocado - The avocado tree is native to South Central Mexico.

14> France - Port Salut comes from Pays de la Loire, France.

15> Balaton - Balaton is a sweet-tart cherry.
