$1>$ The Flying Circus - This group was also referred to as The Richthofen Circus. $2>1927$ - Charles and his plane, which he called The Spirit of St. Louis, made the flight in a little over thirty-three hours.

$4>1902$ - Mount Pelee is a volcano on the island of Martinique. In 1902 this stratovolcano killed over 30, 000.
$5>$ Locusts - Morocco is a nation in the Northern part of Africa. This country has been the target of locusts on many different occasions.
$6>1797$ - John Adams left office in 1801 . He was succeeded by Thomas Jefferson.
7> England - This plot, which occurred in 1605, was an attempt to assassinate the King by blowing up Parliament House.
$8>1888$ - The serial killer known as Jack the ripper was never apprehended. The crimes remain unsolved.
9> Queen Victoria - Queen Victoria reigned for 63 years and three months. $10>$ Spain - The British were led by Admiral Lord Nelson. This was one of the most decisive wins for Britain in history.
$11>1922$ - Stalin was in office from the 3rd of April 1922 to the 16th of October 1952.
$12>$ Edward VI - Edward was crowned in 1547, at the age of nine.
$13>$ Charlemagne - Charlemagne, was crowned King along with his brother in 768 when their father, Pepin the Short died.
14> Kublai Khan - The Yuan Dynasty was ruled over most of China until 1368. $15>$ Qin Shi Huang - Qin Shi Huang was the first Emperor of China. He began building the wall in 220 BC.
$16>$ Sir Edmund Barton - Sir Edmund Baton took office in 1901. He was a member of the Protectionist Party.
