## Answers:

1> Panama - The invasion led to the Panamanian dictator Manuel Noriega being deposed.

2> China - Due to its relative ease of use, the development of the crossbow caused a significant shift in the role of ranged weaponry among armies.

3> London - The bomb was designed by Robert Lusser.

4> Alexander the Great - The battle took place in modern-day Punjab, Pakistan.

5> Nagasaki - The bomb was dropped on Nagasaki by parachute from an American B29 Bomber.

6> Over 18 - Resulting in a Communist victory, the war lasted 18 years, four months, four weeks and one day.

7> Panther - Considered the best German tank of the war, the Panther was a medium tank with a crew of five.

8> Belgium - About 1 mile from the town of Waterloo.

9> Brig. Gen. P. G. T. Beauregard - Brig. Gen. Irvin McDowell led the Union Army.

10> About 5,000 - German Field Marshal Paulus led the Germans. He survived the war and died in 1957.

11> Cuba - Its purpose was to overthrow the revolutionary left wing government of Fidel Castro.

12> Germany - Two German Zeppelins dropped 24 bombs on Great Yarmouth and the surrounding area. Four civilians were killed.
