- 7> Sheb Wooley He also played Pete Nolan on Clint Eastwood's Rawhide TV series.
- 8> Supertramp Miesegaes dropped them after two bad albums.
- 9> David Lee Roth He was an EMT for the city of New York from 2004 to 2006, during which he was only recognized three times.
- 10> Grand Funk Railroad The Rolling Stones called Grand Funk the worst rock band in the world, but this was long before anybody had heard Nickelback.
- 11> I Want to Hold Your Hand They wrote it at Jane Asher's parents' house.
- 12> O'Jays The Triumphs renamed themselves in 1963 for Cleveland DJ Eddie O'Jay.
