Answers:

1> The Beatles - Released in 1963, I Want to Hold Your Hand was the Beatles' first American number one.

2> Jefferson Airplane - White Rabbit was written by Grace Slick and released by Jefferson Airplane on their 1967 album, Surrealistic Pillow.

3> The Who - The Kids Are Alright was released on the Who's debut album My Generation in 1966.

4> The Rolling Stones - Released in 1968, Rolling Stone magazine placed it at number 32 in their list of The 500 Greatest Songs of All Time.

5> Marvin Gaye - I Heard It Through the Grapevine was originally released by Gladys Knight and the Pips in 1967.

6> Bob Dylan - Released in 1965, Rolling Stone magazine listed the song at number one in their list of The 500 Greatest Songs of All Time.

7> Nancy Sinatra - These Boots Are Made for Walkin' hit number one on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1966.

- 8> The Monkees - Released by the Monkees in 1966, the song was written and originally recorded by Neil Diamond.
- 9> The Beach Boys - California Girls was released on the album Summer Days (And Summer Nights!!) in 1965.
- 10> The Zombies - Released in 1964, She's Not There was the Zombie's debut single.
- 11> Buffalo Springfield - Written by Stephen Stills, For What It's Worth was recorded in December of 1966.
- 12> Cream - Sunshine Of Your Love was released on Cream's second album Disraeli Gears in 1967.
- 13> Glen Campbell - Campbell's version of Wichita Lineman appeared on his 1968 album of the same name.
- 14> Peter, Paul And Mary - Recorded in 1962, the lyrics for the song were based on a 1959 poem by Leonard Lipton.
- 15> The Marcells - Blue Moon was written by Richard Rodgers and Lorenz Hart in 1934. The Marcells recorded it in 1961.
- 16> The Association - Along Comes Mary was released on the Association's debut album And Then... Along Comes the Association in 1966.
- 17> The Ronettes - Released in 1963, Brian Wilson of the Beach Boys has stated that 'Be My Baby' is the greatest pop song ever recorded.
- 18> Badfinger - Come And Get It was written by Paul McCartney and released by Badfinger in 1969.
- 19> Ray Charles - Hit the road Jack hit number one for two weeks on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1961.
- 20> Roger Miller - King of the Road was written and originally recorded by Roger Miller in 1965.
- 21> Steppenwolf - Steppenwolf released Magic Carpet Ride in 1968 on the album The Second.
