- 4> Mountain - Mississippi Queen was released on Mountain's 1970 debut album Climbing!.
- 5> Norman Greenbaum - Greenbaum said that he was inspired to write the song after watching Porter Wagoner on TV singing a gospel song.
- 6> Edison Lighthouse - Love Grows Where My Rosemary Goes was released as a single in 1970.
- 7> Argent - Released in 1972 on the album All Together Now.
- 8> Albert Hammond - Released in 1972 on the album It Never Rains in Southern California.
- 9> Brewer And Shipley - One Toke Over the Line made Rolling Stone's 15 Greatest Stoner Songs list at number 8.
- 10> Free - From Free's 1970 album Fire and Water.
- 11> Billy Paul - From the 1972 album 360 Degrees of Billy Paul.
- 12> Mary MacGregor - Released in 1976, Torn Between Two Lovers was written by Peter Yarrow and Phillip Jarrell.
- 13> Lou Reed - Released on Reed's 1972 album Transformer.
- 14> Paper Lace - From the 1974 debut album Paper Lace.

- 15> Billy Swan - From Swan's 1974 album I Can Help.
- 16> Carl Douglas - Kung Fu Fighting was released as a single in 1974.
- 17> Dave Loggins - Please Come to Boston was nominated for a Best Male Pop Vocal Performance Grammy Award.
- 18> Terry Jacks - Released on the 1974 album Seasons in the Sun.
- 19> Brownsville Station - Released in 1973 on Brownsville Station's album Yeah!
- 20> Starland Vocal Band - Afternoon Delight was a number-one U.S. Hot 100 single in July of 1976.
- 21> Ram Jam - Based on the 20th-century African-American work song.
- 22> Nick Gilder - Released on the 1978 album City Nights.
- 23> Boomtown Rats - The song was inspired by the Cleveland Elementary School shooting that occurred on January 29, 1979.
- 24> Rick Dees - The voice of the duck in the song was provided by Ken Pruitt.
- 25> Debby Boone - You Light Up My Life won the 1978 Grammy Award for Song of the Year.
