1> Victor Davis - It was only a few months after his retirement from swimming, on November 11, 1989.

2> John Turner - Iona was the 27th Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia and the first woman to hold the position.

3> Vancouver - Vancouver is the eighth largest Canadian city with a population of 603,000 (2011 census).

4> Robin - Printing of the \$2 bill ceased on February 18, 1996, with the release of a \$2.00 coin called the toonie.

5> Canadian Open (golf) - When he won, he became the first Canadian to do so since 1914.

6> Alberta - The Royal Tyrell Museum of Paleontology has a collection of more than 130,000 fossils.

7> 0.0667 - Canada is the second-largest country in the world, after Russia.

8> Ontario - In recent years, Eves' support of the Conservative Party of Canada has been less than warm.

9> Boulevard Rene-Levesque - Rene Levesque Boulevard is one of the main streets in Montreal.

10> Mike - Lester won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1957.

11> Moose Jaw - Other attractions include the Moose Jaw Trolley, the Temple Gardens Mineral Spa Resort and the Western Development Museum.

12> Toronto - Toronto is the capital of Ontario and the largest city in Canada.

13> Alex Baumann - Alex went on to win three gold medals at the 1986 Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh.
