1> The first names of two Southern U.S. Blues musicians - The band took the first names of Carolina Blues musicians Pink Anderson and Floyd Council

2> Vancouver - Their debut 'Dreamboat Annie' peaked at #7 in the charts.

3> Rush - Their debut album 'RUSH' became the biggest selling debut LP that any Canadian band had ever released.

4> Five Man Electrical Band - Released in 1970, 'Signs' can be found on the Five Man Electrical Band's second album Good-byes and Butterflies.

5> Burton Cummings - The Guess Who had a huge hit with 'American Woman', which reached number one on the Billboard Hot 100 in 1970.

6> Jethro Tull - 'Thick as a Brick' is perhaps Tull's definitive progressive rock album.

7> Crazy Horse - Neil is an outspoken advocate for environmental issues

8> Joni Mitchell - Joni was born in Fort Macleod, Alberta, Canada.

9> Norman Greenbaum - 'Spirit In The Sky' was also recorded years later by Doctor and the Medics.

10> The Who - Released in 1971, many of the songs were new to the U.S. audience.
