8> Chopin - After Chopin's burial in France, his sister Ludwika took his heart back to Poland in 1850.

9> Baroque - The era of Baroque was followed by the Classical era.

10> 4 - A string quartet consists of two violin players, a viola player and a cellist.

11> Johann - The Blue Danube was first performed in Vienna sometime in February of 1867.

12> Prokofiev - A children's story with both music and text, Peter and the Wolf was written in 1936.

13>88 - The piano was invented sometime around the year 1700.

14> 19th - Johannes wrote a number of major works for orchestra including two serenades, two piano concertos and four symphonies.

15> Oranges - The opera made its debut at the Auditorium Theatre in Chicago, Illinois on December 30th, 1921.
