- 1> Troop - Did you know that apes are considered to be the most intelligent of all the animals on earth?
- 2> Mess - Iguanas can stay underwater for approximately 28 minutes!
- 3> Owls - A herd is the collective noun for both Giraffes and Ibexes! Owls, however, are called a parliament!
- 4> Wolves - Wolves are the largest of the wild canine family and they are found in North America, Eurasia, and North Africa.
- 5> Cluster or Clutter - Cluster and Clutter are both used for spiders! Did you know there are more than 37,000 different species of spiders?
- 6> Swallow - A swallow! Did you know many baby and parent swallows learn each other's voices and stay together over migration.
- 7> Bats - Although Bats are not referred to as an army, they, along with Frogs and Ants can also be referred to as a Colony!
- 8> Mob - Mob! Troop is also used! Did you know Kangaroos can hop at close to 40 mph? They can also hop further than 25 feet in one jump! Some jumps reach 10 feet high!
- 9> Mice - Mice! A collection of elephants is a herd and a collection of clams is a bed.
- 10> Game - Cletch, Peep and Brood are just two of the terms to refer to chickens! Clutch, Flock, and Chattering are a few examples of other collective terms for chickens!
