Answers:

- 1> North Side - North Side was composed mainly of Irish-Americans, but there were also a large number of Polish-Americans.
- 2> Baker Str. - The robbery was a basis for the story for 'The Bank Job' starring Jason Statham.
- 3> Sarajevo - Archduke and his wife were shot by Gavrilo Princip, which set off a chain of events leading to World War I.
- 4> Eugene Vidocq - The story of Eugene Vidocq is quite extraordinary, considering that he himself was a former thief and a crook.
- 5> Ponzi scheme - Although the scheme is named after Charles Ponzi, it had been around for quite some time beforehand.
- 6> Enron - Before Enron went bankrupt, its revenues reached 101 billion USD.
- 7> Corrupting the young and heresy - Socrates spent his life fighting sophists, yet ironically, he was convicted as one.
- 8> Cain - Cain was the first man born of man, and Abel, his brother - the first one to die.
- 9> Corcoran State Prison - Charles Manson avoided the death sentence when the Supreme Court of California suspended capital punishment.
- 10> Robert Shapiro - After the O.J. case, Shapiro stopped working on criminal cases.
- 11> Theodore "Ted" Kaczynski - In 1971, Theodore moved to a remote cabin in Lincoln, Montana, where he lived as a recluse.
- 12> 37 - The killer has not been found.
- 13> Biograph Theater - The last film he saw was Manhattan Melodrama.
- 14> Lester M. Gillis - 'Baby Face' was a known associate of John Dillinger.
- 15> Pablo Escobar - Pablo Escobar also said 'I prefer to be in the grave in Colombia than in a jail cell in the United States.', which eventually came true.
