- 1> Irish Coffee - According to some sources, the original Irish coffee was invented and named by Joe Sheridan.
- 2> Fortune cookie - He was inspired by a Japanese treat called tsujiura sembei. A bit later came Canton-native David Jung, who founded the Hong Kong Noodle Company.
- 3> Cucumber - It is commonly used in gyros and souvlaki.
- 4> Orange - In addition to being consumed neat, Cointreau is also used in many cocktails.
- 5> Shawarma - dog - Shawarma can be many meats but not dog.
- 6> They were invented in the Anchor Bar in Buffalo, New York - The spicy chicken wings served with blue-cheese dressing were invented in 1964 by Teresa Bellissimo.
- 7> Casaba - It is one of the honeydew muskmelons.
- 8> Van Dyck (vandyking) - The pointy beard is named for him, too.
- 9> South Beach - It was a low-carb diet.
- 10> Meatballs - They are small and fried.
- 11> Chinese - The most common set-up is star anise, cloves, cinnamon, Sichuan pepper and ground fennel seeds.
- 12> Loganberry and blackberry - Walter Knott made the boysenberry famous at his eponymous berry farm in California.
- 13> Cellophane - They're called cellophane noodles or glass noodles.
- 14> Orange Juice - Two parts orange juice to one part champagne.
