## Answers:

- 1> With ice cream - It can also mean braised with wine.
- 2> Toucan - Don't replace milk with Guinness on your Froot Loops, though.
- 3> Duck sauce - Often served in little plastic packets, it is used as a dipping sauce.
- 4> Botulism - Sausage production creates a moist, warm, anerobic environment ideal for Clostridium botulinum.
- 5> Philadelphia - That's a lot of cheese!
- 6> Turkey - There are other theories as well, involving inactivity and booze.
- 7> Chicken soup - The cysteine comes from the chicken, potassium from vegetables (especially parsnips), piperine from the pepper, and alliin from garlic.
- 8> Chefs - By tradition, it has 100 pleats, one for each way to make an egg.
- 9> Liver - It literally means 'paste of the fat liver'. The geese (sometimes ducks) are force-fed until they get fatter than the average computer nerd.
- 10> Sauerkraut - The name literally means 'sour cabbage' in German.
- 11> Onions - It acidifies when it comes in contact with water, which is why it stings your eyes. Chilling the onions first neutralizes the propanethial-S-oxide.
- 12> Navy - The dish is often sweetened with molasses or maple syrup and flavored with salt pork or bacon.
- 13> St. Louis - The city also prides itself on its toasted ravioli and gooey butter cake.
- 14> Cortina d'Ampezzo - The community is in Italy.
- 15> Dame Nellie Melba - Melba toast was a dry toast to help her upset tummy, and peach Melba is a peachy ice cream with raspberry sauce. French chef Georges Auguste Escoffier named the dishes.
