- 8> Guadalcanal Of the more than 36,000 Japanese soldiers on Guadalcanal, about 26,000 were killed.
- 9> Governor of New York As of 2013, Franklin Roosevelt is the longest serving U.S. president. He served from March 4, 1933 to April 12, 1945.
- 10> Victoria Victoria reigned for 63 years, 216 days.
- 11> San Francisco When founded, the UN had 51 member states. As of 2012, there are 193.
- 12> The Versailles Treaty The Versailles Treaty ended the state of war between Germany and the Allied Powers during World War I.
