- 1> Pericles His name translates to 'One surrounded by glory'.
- 2> Battle of Gaugamela After the battle, the bulk of Darius' army was defeated, although Darius himself managed to escape Alexander's reach.
- 3> Cohort There were various types of cohorts, such as cohors classica with sailors, or cohors saggitaria containing archers.
- 4> Hannibal Hannibal is sometimes referred to as the father of strategy.
- 5> Battle of Tours Battle of Tours is also called the Battle of Poitiers.
- 6> Standard Joan was a standard-bearer and some historians argue her main function was supporting morale, rather than aiding physically in battle.
- 7> A special type of bomb ship. Hellburners were essentially floating bombs, used mostly by the Dutch against Spain.
- 8> Battle of Austerlitz The 'three emperors' are Napoleon, Tsar Alexander I and Holy Roman Emperor Francis II.
- 9> China Gunpowder was used to propel rockets and even early grenades not to mention guns.
- 10> Army of the Potomac The army of the Potomac played a very important role in the Battle of Gettysburg.
- 11> Chlorine Deadly gases are often named as the first WMD.
- 12> Operation Detachment The battle lasted over a month.
- 13> 2 Aircraft carriers are considered the true measure of a superpower.
- 14> There was a 2-day ceasefire for the Vietnamese New Year celebrations. The Tet Offensive was widely televised and resulted in the loss of support for the war among Americans.
