1> A Hard Day's Night - Ringo's real name is Richard Starkey.

2> Vines - The song reached #32 on the UK Singles Chart.

3> Neve Campbell - Neve Campbell is a Canadian actress, probably best known for her role in the 1990s television series, Party of Five.

4> The Rolling Stones - The first recognized line-up consisted of Brian Jones, Ian Stewart, Mick Jagger, Keith Richards, Bill Wyman and Charlie Watts.

5> The Beach Boys - Rolling Stone magazine listed The Beach Boys at number 12 on their list of the '100 Greatest Artists of All Time'.

6> More Human Than Human - The song's title, as well as some of the lyrical references, were taken from the film Blade Runner.

7> Beethoven - Beethoven's best known compositions include 9 symphonies, 32 piano sonatas, 5 concertos for piano and 16 string quartets.

8> Chicago - Bob Fosse died from a heart attack in 1987.

9> Another One Bites the Dust - Written by Queen bassist John Deacon, the song can be found on the group's eighth studio album 'The Game' released in 1980.

10> Johann Strauss II - Johann Strauss II was known as 'The Waltz King' during his lifetime.

11> Smith Thompson - The song is a tribute to the memory of four assassinated Americans - Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther King Jr., John F. Kennedy and Robert F. Kennedy.

12> George Jones - Jones and Wynette recorded some duet albums and singles that hit the charts throughout the 1970s.

13> Amahl and the Night Visitors - It was first performed by the NBC Opera Theatre on December 24, 1951, in New York City and broadcast live.

14> Split Enz - Featuring Phil Judd and brothers Tim Finn and Neil Finn, the group Split Enz was from New Zealand.

15> Texas - 'The Yellow Rose of Texas' is a traditional folk song that was first published in 1858.
