Answers:

1> Batman - He also rebooted a darker version of Daredevil.

2> Harvey Keitel - Martin Sheen replaced Harvey Keitel and had a heart attack during the 16-month shoot.

3> The laugh track - He took hours of recorded laughter and spliced them together for what he called the Laff Box.

4> Coast Guard helicopters - Basically, the Professor finally figured out how to build a raft. Coast Guard helicopters spotted smoke from their raft.

5> Jason Alexander - The makeup made it appear that Kurros was from an alien race that had human female genitalia on its foreheads.

6> South Park - It later emerges that he, and only he, is aware of these constant deaths, and that he is cursed because his parents were Cthulhu cultists.

7> Oscar Hammerstein II - He won for The Last Time I Saw Paris from 'Lady Be Good' and for It Might As Well Be Spring from 'State Fair'.

14> Vito Corleone - Marlon Brando and Robert De Niro won them for the two Godfather movies.
