4> Charlie Chaplin - The American Film Institute ranked Chaplin the 10th-greatest American male screen legend of all time in 1999.

5> In Living Color - In January of 2012, Jennifer returned as a judge on the 11th season of American Idol, earning an estimated \$20 million.

6> Charles Laughton - Charles was the fill-in host when Elvis Presley made his first appearance on The Ed Sullivan Show on the 9th of September 1956.

7> Planet of the Apes - Planet of the Apes was released in the United States on February 8, 1968. It earned over \$32 million at the box office.
