$4>$ Gold Medal - Middleweight Boxing - He was just 17 years of age at the time.
$5>$ Janet Guthrie - She was also the first woman to participate in the Daytona 500.
$6>$ Jack Nicklaus - Jack has won 18 career major championships during his career.
7> A.J. Foyt - With 67 wins, Foyt currently holds the all-time American championship racing career wins record.
8> Goalie's Face Mask - Jacques' jersey \#1 was retired by the Montreal Canadiens in 1995.
$9>$ Horse racing - The terms are also used in golf.
$10>10$ Feet - The bottom of the hoop backboard is 9 feet $69 / 16$ inches from the floor. 11> Bobby Orr - During his short career, Orr earned many awards including a Calder trophy and eight consecutive Norris trophies.

12> Rickey Henderson - Nicknamed "The Man of Steal", Rickey played for nine MLB teams during his career.
13> Kentucky Derby - A horse must win all three races to win the Triple Crown.
14> Greenbay Packers - Based in Green Bay, Wisconsin, the Packers have won more championships than any other team in the NFL at 13.
15> Mark Spitz - Between the years 1968 and 1972, Mark won nine Olympic golds plus a silver and a bronze.
