- 7> Tennis The Davis Cup tournament began in 1900. Initially it was a contest between Great Britain and the United States.
- 8> Equestrian The equestrian events had to be held in Stockholm due to Australian regulations regarding quarantine of animals.
- 9> Dentist Cary received his DDS degree in 1944. During WWII, he served in the United States Dental Corps.
- 10> Horseback riding accident Her right leg was crushed in the fall. Although, Maureen was only 19 at the time, she already had three wins at Wimbledon.
- 11> Gordie Howe This record stands at 1, 767. Mark Messier holds the record for most games played including playoffs at 1,992.
- 12> Stanley Matthews Stanley was a British Soccer player. He is the only player to have been knighted while still actively playing.
- 13> Im Dong-Hyun Dong-Hyun scored a 699 in the men's individual. He represented South Korea.
- 14> Affirmed Affirmed won the honor in 1978. He was ridden by Steve Cauthen.
- 15> Jamaica Usain has won two Olympic gold medals for his country.
