- 1> Miami Beach Created by Arthur Agatson, it is similar to, but not as extreme as, the Atkins diet.
- 2> Baton Rouge The name refers to a red cypress tree that marked the boundaries between the hunting grounds of two Indian tribes.
- 3> Hoover Dam It was originally called Boulder Dam.
- 4> Venice He built more than 20 miles of canals for his gondolas, as well as palazzo mansions. Today, its boardwalk is full of buskers and rollerskaters.
- 5> Coney Island Trolley parks were designed to give people a reason to use trolleys on weekends. They were meant for picnics, but Coney Island started to add rides.
- 6> Parishes It has 64 of them. Orleans Parish, home to New Orleans, was one of the original 19 from 1807.
- 7> North Carolina This is because of violent weather and treacherous shoals. The Diamond Shoals are especially deadly.
- 8> Utah The Great Salt Lake is the largest bit still left.
- 9> Michigan It's in the mitten-shaped Lower Peninsula.
- 10> It's been erupting It is considered the world's most active volcano.
- 11> Nashville Its Parthenon bronze doors may be the world's largest.
- 12> Chicago Designed to be temporary, most of the buildings were destroyed in an 1894 fire, possibly by striking Pullman workers.
