1> Barbara Cartland - Cartland died on the 21st of May 2000 at the age of 98.

2> Stevie Wonder - Stevie Wonder was born in Saginaw, Michigan, in 1950.

3> Thomas Edison - Edison is one of the most prolific inventors in history, holding 1,093 US patents in his name.

4> Margaret Thatcher - Thatcher resigned as Prime Minister and party leader in November of 1990.

5> Jane Wyman - They were married on January 26, 1940 and divorced in 1948.
6> Prince Charles - Charles broke tradition and proceeded straight from secondary school into university, as opposed to joining the Armed Forces.

7> Alfred Hitchcock - Hitchcock died at the age of 80 on the 29th of April 1980.
